


CAQH ProView and NCQA Attestation

The latest attestation date is electronically-stamped on the top of the provider's AAR and Application each time he/she attests in CAQH ProView. Any AAR that is printed/viewed will have the newest date on the top. While the handwritten date at the bottom may be more than 120 days old, the AAR is acceptable as long as the electronic date at the top is within the right timeframe.
